2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE GENDER EQUITY REPORTING STATUTE.
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 143-157.1 reads as rewritten:
5	"§ 143-157.1. Reports on gender-proportionate appointments to statutorily created
6	decision-making regulatory bodies.
7	(a) <u>Appointments. – In appointing members to any statutorily created</u>
8	decision-making or regulatory board, commission, council, or committee of the State, to
9	public bodies set forth in subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the appointing authority
10	should select, from among the most qualified persons, those persons whose appointment
11	would promote membership on the board, commission, council, or committee body that
12	accurately reflects the proportion that each gender represents in the population of the
13	State as a whole or, in the case of a local board, commission, council, or committee,
14	body, in the population of the area represented by the board, commission, council, or
15	committee, body, as determined pursuant to the most recent federal decennial census,
16	unless the law regulating such appointment requires otherwise. If there are multiple
17	appointing authorities for the board, commission, council, or committee, body, they may
18	consult with each other to accomplish the purposes of this section.
19	(b) <u>Reports Generally. – Except as provided at the end of this section, each Each</u>
20	appointing authority described in subsection (a) shall submit a report to the Secretary of
21	State annually by December 1-which discloses the number of appointments made during
22	the preceding year from each gender and the number of appointments of each gender
23	made, expressed both in numerical terms and as a percentage of the total membership of
24	the board, commission, council, or committee. body. A copy of the report shall be
25	submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the
26	President Pro Tempore of the Senate. In addition, each appointing authority shall
27	designate a person responsible for retaining all applications for appointment, who shall
28	ensure that information describing each applicant's gender and qualifications is available
