The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
<b>SECTION 1.</b> Section 19 of Article I of the North Carolina Co	onstitution
reads as rewritten:	
"Sec. 19. Law of the land; equal protection of the laws.	
No person shall be taken, imprisoned, or disseized of his freehold, lib	
privileges, or outlawed, or exiled, or in any manner deprived of his life,	•
property, but by the law of the land. No person shall be denied the equal pro-	
the laws; nor shall any person be subjected to discrimination by the State b	because of
race, color, religion, or national origin.	
Private property shall not be taken except for a public use, including pre	<u>eservation</u>
for that use. Public use does not include the taking of property for the p	urpose of
thereafter conveying an interest in the property to a third party for	<u>economic</u>
development. This paragraph does not apply to the taking of blighted pro	perties as

determined by a jury."

**SECTION 2.** The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the next statewide primary or election, which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State.

Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:

Constitutional amendment to prohibit condemnation of private property to be owned by other private owners for economic development and to provide for the payment of just compensation with right of trial by jury in all condemnation cases."

**SECTION 3.** If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act becomes effective upon certification and applies to takings after that date.

**SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
