12			"habilitation" and "rehabilitation" shall include auditory training,
13			speech reading, aural rehabilitation, hearing aid use evaluation and
14			recommendations, and fabrication of earmolds and similar accessories
15			for clinical testing purposes only.purposes.

27		applicant must submit a verified clinical clock hour summary sheet
28		signed by the clinic or program director, in addition to completion of
29		the license application.

13	SECTION 7. Section 4 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2007. The			
14	remaining sections are effective when this act becomes law.
