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2 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN INDEPENDENT STUDY COMMISSION TO 3 CONSIDER THE DESIRABILITY AND FEASIBILITY OF ADAPTING THE 4 USE OF A TRACT OF STATE-OWNED LAND, LOCATED IN THE 5 SOUTHEASTERN PART OF THE STATE ON THE NORTHEAST CAPE FEAR 6 RIVER AND THE BURGAW CREEK THAT IS CURRENTLY STATE 7 GAMELANDS, TO SHOWCASE THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT OF 8 SOUTHEASTERN NORTH CAROLINA, PROVIDE **ENVIRONMENTAL** 9 EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH AND ADULTS, AND 10 PROVIDE RECREATIONAL **OPPORTUNITIES** FOR **OUTDOOR** 11 ENTHUSIASTS. 12 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Commission Created. - The Northeast Cape Fear - Burgaw 13 14 Creek Preserve Study Commission is created. 15 SECTION 2.(a) Membership. - The Commission shall consist of 13 16 members. The Chairman of the Wildlife Resources Commission, or the Chairman's 17 designee; the Director of the Division of Forest Resources of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, or the Director's designee; and the Director of the 18 19 Division of Parks and Recreation of the Department of Environment and Natural 20 Resources, or the Director's designee, shall serve as ex officio members. The remaining 21 members shall be appointed no later than September 1, 2007, as follows: 22 Three members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore (1)23 of the Senate. 24 (2)Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the 25 Speaker of the House of Representatives. Two representative of local government, appointed by the President 26 (3) 27 Pro Tempore of the Senate. 28 One representative of a conservation group, appointed by the Speaker (4) 29 of the House of Representatives.

36	SECTION 4. Report. – Prior to the convening of the 2009 Gene	-
37	Assembly, the Commission shall submit a report of its findings and recommendation	
38	including legislative and funding recommendations, to the 2009 General Assembly.	
39	Commission shall terminate upon filing its report.	
40	SECTION 5. Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission sh	nall
41	receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3	3.1,
42	138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.	
43	SECTION 6. Chair; Meetings. – The President Pro Tempore of the Sen	
44	and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate one member	' to

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1 serve as cochair of the Commission. The cochairs shall call the initial meeting of the Commission on or before October 1, 2007. The Commission shall subsequently meet 2 3 upon such notice and in such manner as its members determine. A majority of the 4 members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum. The Commission may meet in 5 the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the 6 Legislative Services Commission. 7 **SECTION 7.** Staff. – Upon the prior approval of the Legislative Services 8 Commission, the Legislative Services Officer may assign professional and clerical staff 9 and other services and supplies, as needed for the Commission to carry out its duties in 10 an effective manner.

SECTION 8. Cooperation by Government Agencies. – The Commission may call upon any department, agency, institution, or officer of the State or any political subdivision thereof for data or other assistance.
