1	(c) Any person violating this section shall have committed an infraction and shall
2	pay a penalty of <u>not more than</u> twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).(\$25.00), even if more than
3	one child less than 16 years of age are riding in the open bed or open cargo area of a
4	vehicle. Conviction of an infraction under this section has no consequence other than
5	payment of a penalty. A person found responsible for a violation of this section may not
6	shall be assessed court costs. A person violating this section shall be assessed two
7	drivers license points by the division.
8	(d) No drivers license points or insurance surcharge shall be assessed on account
9	of violation of this section. A violation of this section shall not constitute negligence per
10	se or contributory negligence per se. A violation of this section shall not be evidence of
11	negligence or contributory negligence."
