13	The contractor shall not be an employee or independent contractor of any organization		
14	that delivers professional development to teachers in North Carolina.

1 Be presented in both a printed form and an electronic version; and (3) 2 (4) Provide recommendations on the roles that regional education service 3 centers created within the Department of Public Instruction could play 4 in the delivery of professional development throughout the State. 5 **SECTION 4.** The contractor shall submit a written progress report every 6 four weeks to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee. The contractor 7 shall complete the report within four months. At the completion of the study, the 8 contractor shall submit a draft of the report document to the Joint Legislative Education 9 Oversight Committee for review. Within 30 days of completing the study, the 10 contractor shall submit a final report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight 11 Committee. The Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee may, in its 12 discretion, schedule a formal presentation of the report when it is submitted. 13 **SECTION 5.** There is appropriated one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) 14 from the General Fund to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee to carry

- 15 out this study.
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SECTION 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
