1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LICENSURE OF IRRIGATION CONTRACTORS.
3	Whereas, North Carolina has been in an extreme drought, and water is our
4	most basic and precious natural resource; and
5	Whereas, the efficient use of water is of utmost importance; and
6	Whereas, the North Carolina Green Industry Council has an annual economic
7	impact of \$8.7 billion and offers employment to over 150,000 people in the State; and
8	Whereas, the proper design, installation, repair, and maintenance of landscape
9	irrigation systems is critical to increase the efficiency of water use; and
10	Whereas, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has suggested that
11	proper and efficient irrigation practices can reduce water consumption by at least 20%;
12	and
13	Whereas, the North Carolina Green Industry Council and the Carolinas
14	Irrigation Association recognize the need to require better and more efficient irrigation
15	practices; Now, therefore,
16	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

3	applicant may be licensed under this Chapter as an irrigation contractor if the applicant
4	submits evidence that demonstrates his or her qualifications as prescribed in rules
5	adopted by the Board and meets all of the following qualifications:
6	(1) Is at least 18 years of age.
7	(2) Is of good moral character as determined by the Board.
8	(3) Has at least three years of experience in irrigation construction or
9	contracting or the educational equivalent. Two years of educational
10	training in irrigation construction or contracting shall be the equivalent
11	of one year of experience.
12	(4) Files with the Board and maintains a corporate surety bond executed
13	by a company authorized to do business in this State or an irrevocable
14	letter of credit issued by an insured institution. The surety bond or the
15	letter of credit shall be in the amount of ten thousand dollars
16	(\$10,000). The surety bond or letter of credit shall be approved by the
17	Board as to form and shall be conditioned upon the obligor faithfully
18	conforming to and abiding by the provisions of this Chapter. Any
19	person claiming to be injured by an act of a licensed irrigation
20	contractor that constitutes a violation of this Chapter may institute an
21	action to recover against the licensee and the surety.
22	(b) If the application is satisfactory to the Board, the applicant shall be required
23	to pass an examination administered by the Board. The Board shall establish the scope
24	and subject matter of the examination, and an examination shall be held at least twice a
25	year at a time and place to be determined by the Board. The examination, at a minimum,
26	shall test the applicant's understanding of the following:
27	(1) Efficiency of water use and conservation in the practice of irrigation
28	construction and contracting.

5 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 89G-4, as enacted in Section 1 of this act, becomes 6 effective October 1, 2008. The remainder of this act becomes effective January 1, 2009.
