1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO INCREASE THE INFORMAL BID LIMIT FOR DEPARTMENT OF 3 TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT 4 LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON THE DEPARTMENT OF 5 TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED MINORITY-OWNED AND 6 WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES PROGRAM. 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 136-28.1(a) reads as rewritten: 9 All contracts over one million two hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000) two "(a) million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) that the Department of 10 Transportation may let for construction or repair necessary to carry out the provisions of 11 this Chapter shall be let to a responsible bidder after public advertising under rules and 12 regulations to be made and published by the Department of Transportation. The right to 13 reject any and all bids shall be reserved to the Board of Transportation. Contracts for 14 15 construction or repair for federal aid projects entered into pursuant to this section shall not contain the standardized contract clauses prescribed by 23 U.S.C. § 112(e) and 23 16 C.F.R. § 635.109 for differing site conditions, suspensions of work ordered by the 17 engineer or significant changes in the character of the work. For those federal aid 18 projects, the Department of Transportation shall use only the contract provisions for 19 differing site conditions, suspensions of work ordered by the engineer, or significant 20 21 changes in the character of the work developed by the North Carolina Department of 22 Transportation and approved by the Board of Transportation." 23 SECTION 2. G.S. 136-28.1(b) reads as rewritten: 24 In those cases in which the amount of work to be let to contract for highway "(b)

(b) In those cases in which the amount of work to be let to contract for highway
construction, maintenance, or repair is one million two hundred thousand dollars
(\$1,200,000) two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) or less, at least
three informal bids shall be solicited. The term "informal bids" is defined as bids in
writing, received pursuant to a written request, without public advertising. All such

- 1 contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. The Secretary of
- 2 Transportation shall keep a record of all bids submitted, which record shall be subject to
- 3 public inspection at any time after the bids are opened."
- 4 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
