A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE KIDS VOTING OF NORTH  
2 CAROLINA PROGRAM.  
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4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to Kids Voting of  
6 North Carolina, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of three hundred eighty-five  
7 thousand dollars (\$385,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to be allocated as follows:

8 (1) \$60,000 to be used by the State program to implement new Kids  
9 Voting programs across the State.

10 (2) \$325,000 to be divided on the basis of North Carolina Department of  
11 Public Instruction's average daily membership with a minimum of  
12 \$2,500 for the following counties: Alleghany, Beaufort, Buncombe,  
13 Burke, Cabarrus, Catawba, Chowan, Clay, Cumberland, Davie,  
14 Durham, Forsyth, Greene, Guilford, Haywood, Henderson, Iredell,  
15 Jackson, Lee, Madison, Mecklenburg, New Hanover, Onslow,  
16 Randolph, and Wake to assist those counties with their Kids Voting  
17 programs.

18 **SECTION 2.** If a county that received funds under subdivision (2) of  
19 Section 1 of this act determines it does not need all of its funding, the county may remit  
20 any portion of the funds received to the State program for further expansion of Kids  
21 Voting programs to nonparticipating counties.

22 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
