## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A SALES AND USE TAX HOLIDAY FOR CERTAIN

 ENERGY EFFICIENT PRODUCTS.The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. G.S. 105-164.3 reads as rewritten:

## "§ 105-164.3. Definitions.

The following definitions apply in this Article:
(8g) Energy Star qualified product. - Defined in the Streamlined Agreement.
...."
SECTION 2. G.S. 105-164.13C reads as rewritten:

## "§ 105-164.13C. Sales and use tax holiday.

(a) The taxes imposed by this Article do not apply to the following items of tangible personal property if sold between 12:01 A.M. on the first Friday of August and 11:59 P.M. the following Sunday:
(1) Clothing with a sales price of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or less per item.
(2) School supplies with a sales price of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or less per item.
(2a) School instructional materials with a sales price of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or less per item.
(3) Computers with a sales price of three thousand five hundred dollars $(\$ 3,500)$ or less per item.
(3a) Computer supplies with a sales price of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or less per item.
(3b) Energy Star qualified products in the following categories:
a. Clothes washers, dishwashers, freezers, and refrigerators with a sales price of two thousand dollars $(\$ 2,000)$ or less per item.

b. Central air conditioning units, heat pumps, boilers, and furnaces
with a sales price of six thousand dollars $(\$ 6,000)$ or less per item.
c. Ceiling fans and room air conditioning units with a sales price of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or less per item.
d. Compact fluorescent light bulbs.
e. Programmable thermostats with a sales price of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or less per item.
(4) Sport or recreational equipment with a sales price of fifty dollars (\$50.00) or less per item.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2008, and applies to sales made on or after that date.
