A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE STATEWIDE HEALTH
PROMOTION PROGRAM.

Whereas, chronic diseases are one of the most important public health issues of our time; and

Whereas, heart disease, stroke, diabetes, and cancer are the leading causes of death and escalating health care costs in North Carolina; and

Whereas, the rates of obesity and tobacco use have reached epidemic proportions and are of particular concern with respect to smoking among our youth population; and

Whereas, adequate capacity in all communities across the State is essential to address these urgent health problems; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of four million three hundred thousand dollars (\$4,300,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year and the sum of four million three hundred thousand dollars (\$4,300,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year. These funds shall be used for the Statewide Health Promotion program to support the work of one full-time public health professional in each county to work on the public health issues of physical inactivity, poor nutrition, and tobacco use.

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
