1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO RESOLVE THE BOUNDARY BETWEEN WAKE AND FRANKLIN
3	COUNTIES.
4	Whereas, the County of Franklin was created in 1779; and
5	Whereas, the most recent boundary survey authorization by local act was
6	Chapter 46 of the Private Laws of 1810 and Chapter 77 of the Private Laws of 1808, but
7	no record of the survey has been found; and
8	Whereas, under Sections 1322 and 1323 of the Revisal of 1908, a boundary
9	survey was done in 1915 and approved by the Commissioners of Wake and Franklin
10	Counties; and
11	Whereas, there is uncertainty of the location of the line; and
12	Whereas, the Counties of Wake and Franklin are in the process of a boundary
13	survey to resolve the correct line; and
14	Whereas, the State of North Carolina on February 12, 2007, authorized the
15	survey contract with a notice to proceed; and
16	Whereas, it is desirous to set and ratify the boundary between Franklin and
17	Wake Counties; Now, therefore,
18	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
19	SECTION 1. The boundary between Franklin and Wake Counties, as
20	established by joint commission of the two counties in October 1915, reads as rewritten:
21	"Beginning at the corner of Wake, Franklin, Nash, and Johnston Counties at a
22	marked black-gum on W.J. Gay's land on the west prong of Moccasin Creek, thence by
23	magnetic calls of 1915, N 1 degree 45' W. 116.32 Gunter Chains to a large rock planted
24	near Riley, from which the center of the cross-roads, bears N. 22-1/2 E., distance 3.25
25	chains, and a marked post-oak bears N. 65 degrees E., distance 60 links, and another
26	post-oak bears S. 78 degrees E. distance 68 links.

1	Thence N. 76 degrees 5' W. (passing through the Perry House) 187.50 chains to an
2	iron stake and pine pointers on Ollie Barham's land, and 9.50 chains past Little River.
3	Thence N. 31 degrees 45' W. 275.00 Chains to a rock with red oak, dogwood, pine
4	and three white-oaks as pointers on K.P. Hill's land, formerly Moore land.
5	Thence N. 61 degrees 30' W. 561.75 chains to a rock with hickory, two red-oaks and
6	a post-oak pointers, and ending at the corner Granville County, in Wake County line."
7	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
