2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE PROCEDURE FOR SATELLITE-BASED
3	MONITORING OF SEX OFFENDERS AND TO MAKE OTHER CHANGES TO
4	THE SEX OFFENDER LAWS.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-208.40 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 14-208.40. Establishment of program; creation of guidelines; duties.
8	(a) The Department of Correction shall establish a sex offender monitoring
9	program that uses a continuous satellite-based monitoring system and shall create
10	guidelines to govern the program. The program shall be designed to monitor two
11	categories of offenders as follows:
12	(1) Any offender who is convicted of a reportable conviction as defined by
13	G.S. 14-208.6(4) and who is required to register under Part 3 of Article
14	27A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes because the defendant is
15	classified as a sexually violent predator, is a recidivist, or was
16	convicted of an aggravated offense as those terms are defined in
17	G.S. 14-208.6. An offender in this category who is ordered by the
18	court to submit to satellite based monitoring is subject to that
19	requirement for the person's natural life, unless the requirement is
20	terminated pursuant to G.S. 14-208.36.
21	(2) Any offender who satisfies all of the following criteria: (i) is
22	convicted of a reportable conviction as defined by G.S. 14-208.6(4),
23	(ii) is required to register under Part 2 of Article 27A of Chapter 14 of
24	the General Statutes, (iii) has committed an offense involving the
25	physical, mental, or sexual abuse of a minor, and (iv) based on the
26	Department's risk assessment program requires the highest possible
27	level of supervision and monitoring. An offender in this category who

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Session 2007 **General Assembly of North Carolina** 1 is ordered by the court to submit to satellite based monitoring is 2 subject to that requirement only for the period of time ordered by the 3 court and is not subject to a requirement of lifetime satellite-based 4 monitoring. 5 (b) In developing the guidelines for the program, the Department shall require 6 that any offender who is enrolled in the satellite-based program submit to an active 7 continuous satellite-based monitoring program, unless an active program will not work 8 as provided by this section. If the Department determines that an active program will 9 not work as provided by this section, then the Department shall require that the 10 defendant submit to a passive continuous satellite-based program that works within the 11 technological or geographical limitations. 12 (c) The satellite-based monitoring program shall use a system that provides all of 13 the following: 14 (1)Time-correlated and continuous tracking of the geographic location of 15 the subject using a global positioning system based on satellite and other location tracking technology. 16 17 (2)Reporting of subject's violations of prescriptive and proscriptive 18 schedule or location requirements. Frequency of reporting may range 19 from once a day (passive) to near real-time (active). 20 The Department may contract with a single vendor for the hardware services (d) 21 needed to monitor subject offenders and correlate their movements to reported crime 22 incidents. The contract may provide for services necessary to implement or facilitate 23 any of the provisions of this Part." 24 SECTION 2. Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended 25 by adding a new section to read: 26 "§ 14-208.40A. Determination of satellite-based monitoring requirement by court. 27 When an offender is convicted of a reportable conviction as defined by (a) 28 G.S. 14-208.6(4), during the sentencing phase, the district attorney shall present to the 29 court any evidence that (i) the offender is a recidivist, (ii) the conviction offense was an 30 aggravated offense, or (iii) the offense involved the physical, mental, or sexual abuse of 31 a minor. The district attorney shall have no discretion to withhold any evidence required 32 to be submitted to the court pursuant to this subsection. The offender shall be allowed to present to the court any evidence that the district 33 34 attorney's evidence is not correct. 35 After receipt of the evidence from the parties, the court shall determine (b) 36 whether the offender's conviction places the offender in one of the categories described in G.S. 14-208.33(a), and if so, shall make a finding of fact of that determination, 37 38 specifying whether (i) the offender is a recidivist, (ii) the conviction offense was an 39 aggravated offense, or (iii) the offense involved the physical, mental, or sexual abuse of 40 a minor. 41 Upon finding that the offender is a recidivist, or has committed an aggravated (c) 42 offense, the court shall order the offender to enroll in a satellite-based monitoring

43 program for life.

2	physical, mental, or sexual abuse of a minor, the court shall order that the Department
3	do a risk assessment of the offender. The Department shall have a minimum of 30 days,
4	but not more than 60 days, to complete the risk assessment of the offender and report
5	the results to the court.
6	(e) Upon receipt of a risk assessment from the Department pursuant to subsection
7	(d) of this section, the court shall determine whether, based on the Department's risk
8	assessment, the offender requires the highest possible level of supervision and
9	monitoring. If the court determines that the offender does require the highest possible
10	level of supervision and monitoring, the court shall order the offender to enroll in a
11	satellite-based monitoring program for a period of time to be specified by the court."
12	SECTION 3. Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended
13	by adding a new section to read:
14	"§ 14-208.40B. Determination of satellite-based monitoring requirement in certain
15	circumstances; right to hearing.
16	(a) The Department shall make a determination to require satellite-based
17	monitoring for an offender who has been convicted of a reportable conviction as defined
18	by G.S. 14-208.6(4), and who has not had a determination by a court on whether the
19	offender shall be required to enroll in satellite-based monitoring.
20	(b) If the Department determines that the offender falls into one of the categories
21	described in G.S. 14-208.33(a), the offender shall be required to enroll in satellite-based
22	monitoring.
23	(c) After enrolling in satellite-based monitoring, the offender may file a petition
24	with the court of the county in which the offender resides. Upon the receipt of the
25	petition, the court shall hold a hearing within 10 days to determine if the offender falls
26	into one of the categories described in G.S. 14-208.33(a). The court shall hold the
27	hearing and make findings of fact pursuant to G.S. 14-208.33A.
28	If the court finds that (i) the offender is a recidivist, (ii) the conviction offense was
29	an aggravated offense, or (iii) the offense involved the physical, mental, or sexual abuse
30	of a minor, the court shall order the offender to enroll in satellite-based monitoring for
31	the appropriate period, as set forth in G.S. 14-208.33A.
32	If the court finds that the offender does not fall into one of the categories described
33	in G.S. 14-208.33(a), the offender shall be released from the satellite-based monitoring
34	program, and the Department shall remove and receive all satellite-based monitoring
35	equipment from the offender as soon as possible."
36	SECTION 4. Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended
37	by adding a new section to read:
38	" <u>§ 14-208.40C. Requirements of enrollment.</u>
39	(a) Any offender required to enroll in satellite-based monitoring pursuant to
40	G.S. 14-208.33A who receives an active sentence shall be enrolled and receive the
41	appropriate equipment prior to the offender's release from the Division of Prisons.
42	(b) Any offender required to enroll in satellite-based monitoring pursuant to
43	G.S. 14-208.33A who receives an intermediate sentence shall, immediately upon
44	sentencing, report to the Division of Community Corrections for enrollment in the

1	satellite-based monitoring program, and, if necessary, shall return at any time			
2	designated by that Division to receive the appropriate equipment. If the intermediate			
3	sentence includes a required period of imprisonment, the offender shall not be required			
4	to be enrolled in the satellite-based monitoring program during the period of			
5	imprisonment.			
6	(c) Any offender required to enroll in satellite-based monitoring pursuant to			
7	G.S. 14-208.33A who receives a community service sentence shall, immediately upon			
8	sentencing, report to the Division of Community Corrections for enrollment in the			
9	satellite-based monitoring program, and, if necessary, shall return at any time			
10	designated by that Division to receive the appropriate equipment."			
11	SECTION 5. Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended			
12	by adding a new section to read:			
13	"§ 14-208.40D. Notification of certain offenders.			
14	Any offender subject to this Article that is not under Department supervision at the			
15	time the Department determines that the offender must enroll in satellite-based			
16	monitoring shall be notified by the Department of the requirement that they enroll. The			
17	notification shall be sent by certified mail to the address provided by the offender			
18	pursuant to G.S. 14-208.7.			
19	The notification shall inform the offender of the location the offender is required to			
20	appear to enroll in satellite-based monitoring and receive the appropriate equipment.			
21	The notification shall state that the offender must appear on a date certain. If the			
22	notification is received by the offender after the date provided in the notification, the			
23	offender shall appear at the designated location within 10 days of receipt of the			
24	notification.			
25	For purposes of this section, receipt of notification shall be presumed to be the date			
26	indicated by the certified mail receipt."			
27	SECTION 6. G.S. 14-208.42 reads as rewritten:			
28	"§ 14-208.42. Lifetime registration offenders required to submit to satellite-based			
29	monitoring for life and Offenders required to continue on unsupervised

18	for the presiding judge to state each regular condition of probation in open court, but the

20	Defendants placed on unsupervised probation pursuant to G.S. 14-208.42 are subject
20	to the provisions of this subsection except the regular conditions contained in
22	subdivisions (6), (8), and (11). Defendants placed on unsupervised probation pursuant to
23	any other provision of law are subject to the provisions of this subsection, except that
24	defendants placed on unsupervised probation are not subject to the regular conditions
25	contained in subdivisions (2), (3), (6), (8), and (11)."
26	SECTION 9. G.S. 15A-1343(b2) reads as rewritten:
27	"(b2) Special Conditions of Probation for Sex Offenders and Persons Convicted of
28	Offenses Involving Physical, Mental, or Sexual Abuse of a Minor. – As special
29	conditions of probation, a defendant who has been convicted of an offense which is a
30	reportable conviction as defined in G.S. 14-208.6(4), or which involves the physical,
31	mental, or sexual abuse of a minor, must:
32	(1) Register as required by G.S. 14-208.7 if the offense is a reportable
33	conviction as defined by G.S. 14-208.6(4).
34	(2) Participate in such evaluation and treatment as is necessary to
35	complete a prescribed course of psychiatric, psychological, or other
36	rehabilitative treatment as ordered by the court.
37	(3) Not communicate with, be in the presence of, or found in or on the
38	premises of the victim of the offense.
39	(4) Not reside in a household with any minor child if the offense is one in
40	which there is evidence of sexual abuse of a minor.
41	(5) Not reside in a household with any minor child if the offense is one in
42	which there is evidence of physical or mental abuse of a minor, unless
43	the court expressly finds that it is unlikely that the defendant's harmful
44	or abusive conduct will recur and that it would be in the minor child's

4		related to his rehabilitation.
5	(7)	Submit to satellite-based monitoring pursuant to Part 5 of Article 27A

7		G.S. 14-208.40(a)(1).
8	(8)	Submit to satellite-based monitoring pursuant to Part 5 of Article 27A
9		of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes, if the defendant is in the
10		category described by G.S. 14-208.40(a)(2), and the Department of
11		Correction, based on the Department's risk assessment program,
12		recommends that the defendant submit to the highest possible level of
13		supervision and monitoring.
