5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-52 reads as rewritten:			
7	"§ 20-52. Application for registration and certificate of title.			
8		wner of a vehicle subject to registration must apply to the Divis		
9	certificate of title, a registration plate, and a registration card for the vehicle. To apply,			
10	an owner must complete an application form provided by the Division. Division and			
11	provide a valid North Carolina drivers license or special identification card issued			
12	pursuant to this Chapter. The application form must request all of the following			
13	information and may request other information the Division considers necessary:			
14	(1)	The owner's name.		
15	(1a)	If the owner is an individual, the following information:		
16		a. The owner's mailing address and residence address.		
17		b. The owner's social security number.		
18	(1b)	If the owner is a firm, a partnership, a corporation, or anoth	er entity,	
19		the address of the entity.		
20	(2)	A description of the vehicle, including the following:		
21		a. The make, model, type of body, and vehicle iden	tification	
22		number of the vehicle.		
23		b. Whether the vehicle is new or used and, if a new ve		
24		date the manufacturer or dealer sold the vehicle to the		
25		and the date the manufacturer or dealer delivered the	vehicle to

27	(3)	A statement of the owner's title and of all liens upon the		
28		including the names and addresses of all lienholders in the	order of	
29		their priority, and the date and nature of each lien.		

The application form must contain the disclosures concerning the request for an 1 2 applicant's social security number required by section 7 of the federal Privacy Act of 3 1974, Pub. L. No. 93-579. In accordance with 42 U.S.C. 405(c)(2)(C)(v), the Division 4 may disclose a social security number obtained under this subsection only for the 5 purpose of administering the motor vehicle registration laws and may not disclose the 6 social security number for any other purpose. The social security number of a person 7 who applies to register a vehicle or of a person in whose name a vehicle is registered is 8 therefore not a public record. A violation of the disclosure restrictions is punishable as 9 provided in 42 U.S.C. 405(c)(2)(C)(vii). 10 The requirement to produce a valid North Carolina drivers license or special (a1) 11 identification card under subsection (a) of this section shall not apply to out-of-state 12 students or active duty military personnel who present a valid license from their home 13 state and a valid identification from the school being attended or a valid active duty 14 military identification card. The Division may also issue a registration plate and 15 certificate of title to individuals, who are not able to attain a license due to medical or physical reasons that can be documented and verified by the Division, for a vehicle to 16 be primarily used to transport the applicant. 17 When such application refers to a new vehicle purchased from a manufacturer 18 (b)

or dealer, such application refers to a new vehicle purchased from a manufacturer or dealer, such application shall be accompanied with a manufacturer's certificate of origin that is properly assigned to the applicant. If the new vehicle is acquired from a dealer or person located in another jurisdiction other than a manufacturer, the application shall be accompanied with such evidence of ownership as is required by the laws of that jurisdiction duly assigned by the disposer to the purchaser, or, if no such evidence of ownership be required by the laws of such other jurisdiction, a notarized bill of sale from the disposer."

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**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
