- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5
 - **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-12(23) reads as rewritten:
 - "§ 115C-12. Powers and duties of the Board generally.

The general supervision and administration of the free public school system shall be vested 7 8 in the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall establish policy for the system of free public schools, subject to laws enacted by the General Assembly. The powers 9 10 and duties of the State Board of Education are defined as follows:

- 11 12 (23)Power to Adopt Eligibility Rules for Interscholastic Athletic Competition. -The State Board of Education may adopt rules governing interscholastic 13 athletic activities conducted by local boards of education, including 14 eligibility for student participation. Students attending home schools shall be 15 permitted to participate in interscholastic athletic activities in accord with the 16 requirements of G.S. 115C-565.1. The State Board of Education may 17 authorize a designated organization to apply and enforce the Board's rules 18 governing participation in interscholastic athletic activities at the high school 19 20 level."
 - **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-47(4) reads as rewritten:

22 "§ 115C-47. Powers and duties generally.

23 In addition to the powers and duties designated in G.S. 115C-36, local boards of education 24 shall have the power or duty:

25 26 (4) To Regulate Extracurricular Activities. - Local boards of education shall make all rules and regulations necessary for the conducting of 27 extracurricular activities in the schools under their supervision, including a 28 29 program of athletics, where desired, without assuming liability therefore; 30 provided, that all interscholastic athletic activities shall be conducted in 31 accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the State Board of Education. Education, and that students attending home schools shall be 32 permitted to participate in interscholastic athletic activities in accord with the 33 requirements of G.S. 115C-565.1." 34
