April 8, 2009 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO DEFINE "COORDINATION" FOR PURPOSES OF DETERMINING 3 WHETHER AN IN-KIND CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION HAS OCCURRED. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 163-278.6 is amended to add a new subdivision to read: 6 "(6a) The term "coordination" means, with respect to a disbursement or 7 expenditure, the act of making in consultation with, at the request of, or at 8 the suggestion of a candidate, candidate's committee, or any agent of the candidate or candidate committee. Either of the following shall be the means 9 of proving that "coordination" has occurred with respect to a disbursement or 10 11 expenditure: 12 Evidence that a candidate, candidate's committee, or an agent of a a. candidate or candidate's committee was involved in discussions with 13 the person or entity making the disbursement or expenditure 14 regarding either of the following: 15 The content, intended audience, means or mode of 16 1. communication, specific media outlets, timing, frequency, 17 size, prominence, or duration of the communications funded 18 by the disbursement or expenditure. 19 20 The candidate's needs or plans. 21 Evidence that the person or entity making the disbursement or <u>b.</u> expenditure utilized a vendor that was also used by a candidate or 22 23 candidate's committee in the development of his/her communications strategy, and that such vendor used knowledge or information 24 25 derived from its work for the candidate in the provision of services in connection with the disbursement or expenditure." 26

## **SECTION 2.** G.S. 163-278.6(9a) reads as rewritten:

(9a) The term "independently expend" or "independent expenditure" means an expenditure to support or oppose the nomination or election of one or more clearly identified candidates that is made without consultation or coordination with a candidate or agent of a candidate whose nomination or election the expenditure supports or whose opponent's nomination or election the expenditure opposes. Supporting or opposing the election of clearly identified candidates includes supporting or opposing the candidates of a clearly identified political party. A contribution is not an independent expenditure. As applied to referenda, the term "independent expenditure" applies if consultation or coordination does not take place with a referendum
