4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 163-82.23 reads as rewritten:	
6	"§ 163-82.23. Voter registration at public high schools.	
7	Every public high school shall make available to its students and others who are eligible	e to
8	register to vote the application forms described in G.S. 163-82.3, and shall keep a suffici	ent
9	supply of the forms so that they are always available. A local board of education may, but is	<del>not</del>
10	required to, designate high school employees to assist in completing the forms. Only employ	ees
11	who volunteer for this duty may be designated by boards of education."	
12	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 115C-81(g1) reads as rewritten:	
13	"(g1) Modifications to the social studies curriculum to instruct students on participation	ı in
14	the democratic process and to give them hands-on experience in participating in the democra	atic
15	process:	
16	(1) The State Board of Education shall modify the high school social stud	
17	curriculum to include instruction in civic and citizenship education.	
18	State Board shall require as part of the curriculum instruction to stude	
19	regarding voter eligibility, including age and United States citizenship, a	
20	instruction in the process of completing voter registration forms. T	
21	instruction shall not encourage or in any way try to influence students	
22	register to vote with a particular affiliation. The State Board of Education	
23	strongly encouraged to include, at a minimum, the following components	s in
24	the high school civic and citizenship education curriculum:	
25	a. That students write to a local, State, or federal elected official ab	out
26	an issue that is important to them;	
27	b. Instruction on the importance of voting and otherwise participating	g in
28	the democratic process;	
29	c. Information about current events and governmental structure; and	
30	d. Information about the democratic process and how laws are made.	
31	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:	
32	"(53) Assist with Student Voter Registration. – Local boards of education sh	
33	ensure that voter registration forms are distributed in a timely manner pr	
34	to the voter registration deadline for each primary and general election to	
35	enrolled students 17 years of age and older, in compliance w	
36	G.S. 163-28.23. Local boards of education shall require that schools sub	<u>m1t</u>

1	completed forms on the student applicant's behalf to the county board of
2	elections, and that schools report to the county board of elections, by the
3	twentieth day before a primary or election, the number of students who have
4	received voter applications and the number of completed applications which
5	have been submitted by the school."
6	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with
7	the 2009-2010 school year.
