A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO CREATE THE OFFENSE OF HABITUAL MISDEMEANOR LARCENY. 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Article 16 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by 4 5 adding a new section to read: "§ 14-86.2. Habitual misdemeanor larceny. 6 7 The following definitions apply in this section: (a) 8 'Convicted' means the person has been adjudged guilty of or has entered a (1) 9 plea of guilty or no contest to the misdemeanor larceny charge, and 10 judgment has been entered thereon when the action occurred. 'Misdemeanor larceny' includes the following offenses: 11 (2) Misdemeanor larceny pursuant to G.S. 14-72(a). 12 <u>a.</u> Any repealed or superseded offense substantially equivalent to 13 b. 14 misdemeanor larceny under G.S. 14-72(a) committed within the last 15 10 years. 16 Any offense committed in another jurisdiction substantially similar to <u>c.</u>

(b) A person commits the offense of habitual misdemeanor larceny if that person is 18 years of age or older, commits misdemeanor larceny under G.S. 14-72(a), and has been convicted of five or more prior misdemeanor larceny convictions. A person convicted of violating this section is guilty of a Class H felony.

- (c) For purposes of this section, if an offender is convicted of more than one offense of misdemeanor larceny in a single session of district court, or in a single week of superior court or of a court in another jurisdiction, only one of the convictions may be used to establish the offense of habitual misdemeanor larceny.
- (d) A violation of this section shall not constitute commission of a felony for purposes of G.S. 14-7.6."
- **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
