

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1	(2) Assessment of academic progress. – A student shall demonstrate any
2	required academic eligibility in all subjects taken in the charter school by a
3	method of evaluation agreed upon by the principals of the charter school and
4	the non-charter public school.
5	(d) Registration. – A charter school student shall register with the school his or her
6	intent to participate in interscholastic athletics before the beginning date of the season for the
7	activity in which the student wishes to participate.
8	(e) Fees and Insurance. – A charter school student shall be required to pay any fees for
9	participation required of enrolled non-charter public school students and shall be required to
10	purchase any supplemental insurance required of enrolled non-charter public school students or
11	as reasonably established for participation of charter school students."
12	SECTION 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
13	Public Instruction the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal
14	year. The Department shall use these funds to assist local boards of education in complying
15	with the provisions of this act.
16	SECTION 6. Section 5 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2010. The remainder
17	of this act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2010-2011 school
18	year.
