11	to reduced emergency room visits and hospitalizations, increased use of appropriate services,			
12	and increased	l satisfaction with overall quality of life, including for individuals with significant		
13	mental health	, developmental, or substance abuse disabilities; and		
14	Whereas, stable employment is a critical factor in an individual's ability to succeed			
15	in a community setting; and			
16	Whereas, supportive housing initiatives tend to increase an individual's participation			
17	in work and employment services; and			
18	Whereas, the costs of creating and operating supportive housing are offset by			
19	savings in other public systems; Now, therefore,
