5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article II of the Constitution of North Carolina is amended by adding			
7	a new section to read:			
8	"Sec. 25. Limitation of consecutive terms.			
9	(1) No person shall be eligible for election to more than four consecutive terms as a			
10	member of the House of Representatives. No person shall be eligible for election to more than			
11	four consecutive terms as a member of the Senate. If a person fills a vacancy, it shall be			
12	considered as election to a term for the purpose of this section if the person takes office during			
13	the first calendar year of the term.			
14	(2) <u>Terms of office beginning before January 1, 2009, shall not be considered for the</u>			
15	purpose of this section.			
16	(3) <u>A person disqualified by this section from election to the next succeeding term as a</u>			
17	member of the House of Representatives may not fill a vacancy in that body in the succeeding			
18	term. A person disqualified by this section from election to the next succeeding term as a			
19	member of the Senate may not fill a vacancy in that body in the succeeding term."			
20	<b>SECTION 2.</b> The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to			
21	-	the qualified voters of the State at the general election in November 2010, which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems, or		
22 23	both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The question to be

28	<b>SECTION 3.</b> If a majority of the votes cast on the question are in favor of the			
29	amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the			
30	amendment to the Secretary of State. The amendment becomes effective upon certification. The			
31		Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that		
32	office.
