5 FUND. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 SECTION 1. Part 2B of Article 10 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes reads 8 as rewritten: 9

"Part 2B. NC Green Business Fund.

## 10 "§ 143B-437.4. NC Green Business Fund established as a special revenue fund.

11 Establishment. - The NC Green Business Fund is established as a special revenue (a) 12 fund in the Department of Commerce, and the Department shall be responsible for 13 administering the Fund.

14 Purposes. - Moneys in the NC Green Business Fund shall be allocated pursuant to (b) 15 this subsection. The Department of Commerce shall make grants-no-interest loans from the 16 Fund to private businesses with less than 100 employees, nonprofit organizations, local governments, and State agencies to encourage the expansion of small to medium size 17 businesses with less than 100 employees to help grow a green economy in the State. Moneys in 18 19 the NC Green Business Fund shall be used for projects that will focus on the following three 20 priority areas:

- 21 (1)To encourage the development of the biofuels industry in the State. The 22 Department of Commerce may make grantsno-interest loans available to 23 maximize development, production, distribution, retail infrastructure, and 24 consumer purchase of biofuels in North Carolina, including grants 25 no-interest loans to enhance biofuels workforce development.
- To encourage the development of the green building industry in the State. 26 (2)The Department of Commerce may make grants-no-interest loans available 27 to assist in the development and growth of a market for environmentally 28 29 conscious and energy efficient green building processes. Grants-No-interest loans may support the installation, certification, or distribution of green 30 31 building materials; energy audits; and marketing and sales of green building 32 technology in North Carolina, including grants-no-interest loans to enhance workforce development for green building processes. 33
- To attract and leverage private-sector investments and entrepreneurial 34 (3) 35 growth in environmentally conscious clean technology and renewable



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1	energy products and businesses, including grants no-interest loans to
2	enhance workforce development in such businesses.
3	"§ 143B-437.5. Green Business Fund Advisory Committee.
4	The Department of Commerce may establish an advisory committee to assist in the
5	development of the specific selection criteria and the grant-making loan-making process of the
6 7	NC Green Business Fund.
8	" <b>§ 143B-437.6.</b> Agreements required. Funds may be disbursed from the NC Green Business Fund only in accordance with
9	agreements entered into between the Department of Commerce and an eligible grantee.loan
10	recipient. Each agreement must contain the following provisions:
11	(1) A description of the acceptable uses of <u>grant-loan</u> proceeds. The agreement
12	may limit the use of funds to specific purposes or may allow the funds to be
13	used for any lawful purposes.
14	(2) A provision allowing the Department of Commerce to inspect all records of
15	the business that may be used to confirm compliance with the agreement or
16	with the requirements of this Part.
17	(3) A provision establishing the method for determining compliance with the
18	agreement.
19 20	(4) A provision establishing a schedule for disbursement of <u>loan</u> funds under the
20 21	agreement. (5) A provision requiring recapture of grant-loan funds if a grantee-loan
21	(5) A provision requiring recapture of <u>grant loan</u> funds if a <u>grantee loan</u> recipient subsequently fails to comply with the terms of the agreement.
22	(6) Any other provision the State finds necessary to ensure the proper use of
23 24	State funds.
25	"§ 143B-437.7. Program guidelines.
26	The Department of Commerce shall develop guidelines related to the administration of the
27	NC Green Business Fund and to the selection of projects to receive allocations loans from the
28	Fund, including project evaluation measures. At least 20 days before the effective date of any
29	guidelines or nontechnical amendments to guidelines, the Department of Commerce must
30	publish the proposed guidelines on the Department's Web site and provide notice to persons
31	who have requested notice of proposed guidelines. In addition, the Department must accept oral
32	and written comments on the proposed guidelines during the 15 business days beginning on the
33	first day that the Department has completed these notifications. For the purpose of this section,
34	a technical amendment is either of the following:
35	(1) An amendment that corrects a spelling or grammatical error.
36	(2) An amendment that makes a clarification based on public comment and
37	could have been anticipated by the public notice that immediately preceded
38	the public comment.
39	"§ 143B-437.8. Reports.
40	Grants made to non-State entities through the NC Green Business Fund shall be subject to
41	the oversight and reporting requirements of G.S. 143C 6-23. The Department of Commerce
42	shall conduct an annual audit review of each NC Green Business Fund loan recipient to assess
43	project quality assurance. The Department of Commerce shall publish a report on the
44 45	commitment, disbursement, and use of funds <u>allocated loaned</u> from the NC Green Business
43 46	Fund at the end of each fiscal year. The report is due no later than September 1 and must be submitted to the following:

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## **General Assembly of North Carolina**

**SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Commerce the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the 2009-2010 fiscal year for the NC Green Business Fund to provide no-interest loans to private businesses with less than 100 employees, nonprofit organizations, local governments, and State agencies to encourage the expansion of small- to medium-sized businesses with less than 100 employees to help grow a green economy in the State.

7 SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act is effective when it becomes law. Section 2 of
 8 this act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
