9	SECT	FION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law. It app	lies to any primary		
10	or election for which the final day of voting is after the day this act becomes law. If the early				
11	voting period for a primary or election falls in whole or in part before or on the day this act				
12	becomes law, but the final day of voting for the primary or election occurs after the day this act				
13	becomes law, the assistance available to the voter during early voting shall be the same as that				
14	available to the v	oter on the final day of voting.
