32	1 of this act shall be filled by the district attorney currently serving District 20A who resides in				
33	Richmond County. That district attorney's term expires December 31, 2014, and a successor				
34	shall be elected in the 2014 election.				
35	SECTION 3.	The district attorney position established for D	istrict 20E by Section		
36	1 of this act shall be filled by election in the 2010 election for a four-year term commencing				
37	January 1, 2011.				
38	SECTION 4. The seven assistant district attorney positions established for District				
39	20A by Section 1 of this act shall be filled by seven assistant district attorneys currently serving				
40	Anson and Richmond Counties in District 20A. The five assistant district attorney positions				
41	established for District 20E by Section 1 of this act shall be filled by five assistant district				
42	attorneys currently serving Stanly County in District 20A.				
43	SECTION 5.	G.S. 7A-69 reads as rewritten:

investigatorial assistant is entitled to reimbursement for his subsistence and travel expenses to
the same extent as State employees generally."

SECTION 6. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of one hundred eighty-two thousand eight hundred nine dollars (\$182,809) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act by funding a new district attorney position, a new administrative assistant III position, and a new district attorney investigator.

8 **SECTION 7.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2011, but applies to the 2010 9 election as provided in Section 3 of this act.
