Short Title: Regulate Sales of Glass Vials.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT GLASS VIALS THAT ARE A CERTAIN LENGTH AND
3 DIAMETER THAT MAY BE USED AS DRUG PARAPHERNALIA SHALL BE SOLD
4 FROM BEHIND THE COUNTER AND TO REQUIRE THAT A PURCHASER
5 PROVIDE CERTAIN IDENTIFYING INFORMATION WHEN PURCHASING THESE
6 PRODUCTS.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
9 Article to read:

10 "Article 5F.

11 "Control of Certain Products That May Be Used as Drug Paraphernalia.

12 "**§ 90-113.80. Restriction on sales of certain products that may be used as drug**
13 **paraphernalia.**

14 (a) The following definitions apply in this section:

15 (1) Glass vial. – Tubes of glass, including those that often hold novelty items,
16 that are two to six inches long and one-eighth inch to three-fourths inch in
17 diameter that may be used as drug stems.

18 (2) Retailer. – An individual or entity that is the general owner of an
19 establishment where glass vials are available for sale.

20 (b) No glass vial shall be offered for retail sale by self-service. These products shall be
21 stored and sold behind the counter when sold in any establishment. The retailer shall require
22 every purchaser of a glass vial to furnish photo identification, to enter his or her name and
23 address in a record of sale, and to sign the record of sale attesting to the validity of the
24 information.

25 (c) The retailer shall maintain the record of sale of the glass vial to the consumer for a
26 period of two years from the date of each transaction. The record shall be readily available
27 within 48 hours of the time of the transaction for inspection by an authorized official of a
28 federal, State, or local law enforcement agency. The retailer may destroy the information after
29 two years from the date of the transactions.

30 (d) A retailer shall require that employees of the establishment involved in the sale of
31 glass vials be trained in the requirements of this section, and the retailer shall have a duty to
32 supervise employees in complying with the provisions of this section.

33 (e) This section does not apply to the sale of plastic vials.

34 "**§ 90-113.81. Penalties.**



1 If a retailer willfully and knowingly violates the provisions of G.S. 90-113.80, the retailer
2 shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor for the first offense and a Class 2 misdemeanor for a
3 second offense. A retailer convicted of a third or subsequent offense occurring on the same
4 premises or in another establishment owned or operated by the retailer shall be guilty of a Class
5 1 misdemeanor.

6 **"§ 90-113.82. Immunity.**

7 A retailer or an employee of the retailer who, reasonably and in good faith, reports to any
8 law enforcement agency any alleged criminal activity related to the sale or purchase of glass
9 vials, or who refuses to sell a glass vial to a person reasonably believed to be purchasing one of
10 those products to be used as drug paraphernalia, is immune from civil liability for that conduct
11 except in cases of willful misconduct. No retailer shall retaliate in any manner against any
12 employee of the establishment for a report made in good faith to any law enforcement agency
13 concerning alleged criminal activity related to the sale or purchase of glass vials."

14 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to
15 offenses committed on or after that date.
