25	(1)	Assess the current use of mandatory nurse overtime as a staffing tool in

29		minimum nurse-to-patient ratios will improve patient safety and the quality

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mandatory nurse overtime, (ii) the penalties, if any, that should be imposed on employers that violate the ban, (iii) the remedies, if any, that should be available to a nurse if the nurse's employer violates a ban on mandatory nurse overtime, (iv) the fiscal impact of a ban on mandatory nurse overtime on hospitals and health care organizations, and (v) the impact of a ban on mandatory nurse overtime on the shortage of nurses in specialty and advanced nursing and in various geographic areas of the State.

- Study any other matter related to mandatory nurse overtime that the (5) Commission deems relevant.
- Make an interim report to the 2010 Regular Session of the 2009 General (6) Assembly upon its convening.
- (7) Make a final report to the 2011 General Assembly that includes findings, recommendations, and legislative proposals relating to mandatory nurse overtime.

SECTION 1.(c) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each appoint a cochair for the Commission. The Commission may contract for consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02. Upon approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist in the work of the Commission. Clerical staff shall be furnished to the Commission through the offices of the House of Representatives' and the Senate's Directors of Legislative Assistants. The Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the Legislative Services Commission. Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances at the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1. The appointing authority shall fill vacancies. The Commission, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all the powers provided under the provisions of G.S. 120-19 through G.S. 120-19.4, including the power to request all officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State to provide any information, data, or documents within their possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them and the power to subpoena witnesses.

SECTION 1.(d) The Commission shall terminate upon filing its final report.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Assembly the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2009-2010 fiscal year and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year to fund the work of the Legislative Study Commission on Mandatory Nurse Overtime.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.

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
