5		SECTION 1. There is created the Joint Legislative Study Committee on Family		
6	Violence and Child Custody. The Committee shall consist of 10 members to be appointed as

12		The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate one senator as cochair, and		
13	the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one representative as cochair.			
14	Vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by the same appointing authority who made the			
15 16	initial appointment. The Committee, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all powers			
10 17	provided for under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4. The Committee may			
17	meet at any time upon the joint call of the cochairs. The Committee may meet in the Legislative			
18 19	Building or the Legislative Office Building. The Committee may ineet in the Legislative			
20	clerical, or consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.			
20	The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative Services Officer,			
22	shall assign professional staff to assist the Committee in its work. The Senate's and House of			
23	Representatives' Directors of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical staff to the Committee,			
24	and the expenses relating to the clerical employees shall be borne by the Committee. Members			
25		of the Committee shall receive subsistence and travel expenses at the rates set forth in		
26		G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.		
27	SI	<b>SECTION 2.</b> The Committee shall study the issue of child custody and the impact		
28	family violence has on child custody decisions rendered in North Carolina. In conducting the			
29	study, the Committee shall consider issues related to the following:

## **General Assembly of North Carolina**

1 **SECTION 3.** The Committee shall make a final report of its findings and 2 recommendations to the 2010 Regular Session of the 2009 General Assembly prior to its 3 convening. The Committee shall terminate upon the filing of its final report.

4 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
