10	Whereas, the NC Child Fatality Task Force recommends that no further reductions

13		FION 1.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of		
14		an Services, Division of Health Services, the sum of one million three hundred		
15	eighty-seven thousand dollars (\$1,387,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year to be allocated as

17	(1)	\$350,000 for the March of Dimes to continue to provide outreach,		
18		educational materials, and vitamins through the NC Folic Acid Campaign to		
19		reduce the occurrence of neural tube defects.		
20	(2)	\$330,000 for the East Carolina School of Medicine to continue to operate a		
21		high-risk maternity clinic to improve the birth outcomes of women in the 29		
22 23	(2)	eastern counties.		
23 24	(3)	\$150,000 for the Healthy Start Foundation to continue to provide education and public awareness through the Safe Sleep Campaign to reduce the		
24 25		occurrence of SIDS and sleep-related suffocations.		
25 26	(4)	\$97,000 to the UNC School of Medicine to continue to provide education		
20 27	(4)	and progesterone to reduce preterm births among low-income non-Medicaid		
28		women who have already experienced at least one preterm birth.		
29	(5)	\$460,000 for the Healthy Start Foundation to continue to provide education,		
30		outreach, and the distribution of materials to reduce infant mortality by		
31		improving maternal health prior to and during pregnancy.
