SENATE BILL 1156

Short Title: Defense of Marriage. (Public)

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE MARRIAGE BETWEEN A
3 MAN AND A WOMAN IS THE ONLY DOMESTIC LEGAL UNION THAT SHALL BE
4 VALID OR RECOGNIZED IN THIS STATE.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** Article 14 of the North Carolina Constitution is amended by adding
7 the following new section:

8 "**Sec. 6. Marriage.**

9 Marriage between a man and a woman is the only domestic legal union that shall be valid
10 or recognized in this State."

11 **SECTION 2.** The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to
12 the qualified voters of the State at an election on November 2, 2010, which election shall be
13 conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems, or both
14 may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The question to be used in
15 the voting systems and ballots shall be:

16 "[] FOR [] AGAINST

17 Constitutional amendment to provide that marriage between a man and a woman is
18 the only domestic legal union that shall be valid or recognized in this State."

19 **SECTION 3.** If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the
20 amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the
21 amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so
22 certified among the permanent records of that office.

23 **SECTION 4.** The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act becomes effective
24 January 1, 2011.
