1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO MAKE CLARIFYING, CONFORMING, AND TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS 3 TO VARIOUS LAWS RELATED TO THE ENVIRONMENT, ENERGY, AND 4 NATURAL RESOURCES, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL 5 **REVIEW COMMISSION.** 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 7 SECTION 1. G.S. 114-4.2D reads as rewritten: 8 "§ 114-4.2D. Employment of attorney for Energy Policy Council and Energy Efficiency Program of the Department of Administration Commerce. 9 The Attorney General shall assign an attorney on his staff to work full time with the Energy 10 Policy Council and Energy Efficiency Program of the Department of-Administration 11 Commerce. Such attorney shall be subject to all provisions of Chapter 126 of the General 12 Statutes relating to the State Personnel System. Such attorney shall also perform such 13 14 additional duties as may be assigned to him by the Attorney General." 15 SECTION 2. (d1) Officers; Terms. – The members of the Commission shall elect a chair, vice-chai
and any other officers they consider necessary and shall determine the length of the term of
office, not to exceed two years, of each officer. A majority of the Commission shall constitute
quorum. Each member appointed to the Commission shall be appointed to serve a four-year
term. Any vacancy on the Commission shall be filled by the original appointing authority for
the remainder of the unexpired term. Initial terms commence September 1, 2009."
SECTION 10. G.S. 153B-4 reads as rewritten:

(d) Members; Multiple Offices Membership on the Mountain Area Resource
Technical Advisory Council is hereby declared to be an office that may be held concurrentl

to the maximum number of offices permitted to be held by one person under G.S. 128-1.1.
(e) <u>Chairman Chair</u> and Vice <u>Chairman Chair</u> . – A chairman <u>chair</u> and vice chairman
chair shall be elected annually by the Council.
(f) Compensation. – The members of the Advisory Council who are not Stat
employees may receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the maximum fundation of $C = 128.5$. All expenses shall be raid from fundation of the test the second secon
with the provisions of G.S. 138-5. All expenses shall be paid from funds available to the Commission through the Mountain Area Resources Fund, but no expenses shall be paid if the
Mountain Area Resources Fund lacks the necessary funds."
