2	AN ACT TO RAISE THE CAP ON THE NUMBER OF CHARTER SCHOOLS FROM 100				
3	TO 106; TO GIVE PREFERENCE TO SCHOOLS IN CERTAIN LOW-WEALTH				
4	COUNTIES; TO REQUIRE NEW CHARTER SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE A FREE AND				
5	REDUCED PRICE LUNCH PROGRAM; AND TO REQUIRE EACH NEW CHARTER				
6	SCHOOL TO ACCEPT A MINIMUM NUMBER OF STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE				
7	FREE AND REDUCED PRICE LUNCH PROGRAM, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE				
8	JOINT LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMISSION ON POVERTY REDUCTION AND				
9	ECONOMIC RECOVERY.				
10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
11	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-238.29D(b) reads as rewritten:				
12	"(b) The State Board shall authorize no more than five charter schools per year in one				
13	local school administrative unit. The State Board shall give priority to new applications for				
14	schools that focus on expanded learning experiences for students (i) who are identified as at				
15	risk of academic failure or (ii) who are low income and qualify for free and reduced price lunch				
16	programs and to new applications for schools in the following counties: Alleghany, Avery,				
17	Bladen, Columbus, Edgecombe, Graham, Halifax, Hoke, Northampton, Robeson, Scotland,				
18	Tyrrell, Warren, Watauga, and Yancey. The State Board shall authorize no more than 100106				
19	charter schools statewide. If more than five charter schools in one local school administrative				
20	unit or more than 100 106 schools statewide meet the standards for final approval, the State				
21	Board shall give priority to applications that are most likely to further State education policies				
22	and to strengthen the educational program offered in the local school administrative units in				
23	which they are located."				
24	SECTION 2. Part 6A of Article 16 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is				
25	amended by adding the following new section to read:				
26	" <u>§ 115C-238.29L. Additional requirements for certain charter schools.</u>				
27	In addition to all of the other charter school requirements in Part 6A of Article 16 of this				
28					
29	additional requirements:				
30	(1) The charter school shall accept a minimum number of students who are				
31	eligible for free and reduced price lunch programs. The minimum shall be				
32	determined according to criteria set by the State Board of Education.				
33	(2) Admission policies and procedures shall include a description of how the				
34	school will comply with subdivision (1) of this section.				



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1	(3)	During each period of enrollment, the charter school shall	enroll an eligible
2		student who submits a timely application, unless the numb	
3		exceeds the capacity of a program, class, grade level, or	
4		case, students shall be accepted by lot, except for studen	-
5		granted admission under subdivision (1) of this section	. Once enrolled,
6		students are not required to reapply in subsequent enrollment	nt periods.
7	<u>(4)</u>	The charter school shall participate in the National Schoo	Lunch Program
8		established by the federal government. At the request of t	he charter school
9		and if the local board of the local school administrative u	unit in which the
10		charter school is located operates a free and reduced price	e lunch program,
11		that local board may contract with the charter school to	provide lunch. A
12		local board may charge the charter school a reasonabl	e charge that is
13		sufficient to cover the cost of providing this lunch program.	
14	SECT	TON 3. This act becomes effective when it becomes law a	nd shall apply to
15	all charter school	s that open after July 1, 2012.
