7	SECTION 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new				
8	article to read:

11	"§ 120-70.150. Creation and membership of Joint Legislative Commission on Poverty				
12	Reduction and Economic Recovery.				
13	(a) Findings and Establishment of Commission The General Assembly finds that				
14	poverty in this State is widespread, especially in rural areas and other areas that have lost				
15	significant numbers of agricultural and manufacturing jobs. Further, the General Assembly				
16	finds that an understanding of the causes and effects of poverty are critical in the reduction of				
17	poverty and the economic recovery of low-wealth areas. To that end, there is created the Joint				
18	Legislative Poverty Reduction and Economic Recovery Commission.				
19	(b) Voting Members. – The Commission shall consist of 20 voting members appointed				
20	<u>as follows:</u>				
21	(1) <u>Ten members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, to</u>				
22	<u>include:</u>				
23	a. Seven members of the House of Representatives.				
24	b. Three members of the general public, including persons with				
25	expertise in the fields of business and economic development, public				
26	health, and affordable housing.				
27	(2) Ten members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, to				
28	include:				
29	a. <u>Seven members of the Senate.</u>				
30	b. Three members of the general public, including persons with				
31	expertise in the fields of education, public safety, and child welfare.				
32	Terms on the Commission are for two years and begin on January 15 of each odd-numbered				
33	year, except the terms of the initial members, which begin on appointment and end on January
