A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE CRITERIA USED BY THE COMMITTEE ON DROPOUT
3	PREVENTION TO AWARD THE DROPOUT PREVENTION GRANTS, TO DIRECT
4	THE COMMITTEE ON DROPOUT PREVENTION TO USE EVALUATIONS FROM
5	PRIOR GRANT CYCLES TO IDENTIFY EVIDENCE-BASED PROGRAMMATIC
6	ELEMENTS THAT ARE EFFECTIVE AND REPLICABLE, AND TO ALLOCATE
7	FUNDS TO STUDY HIGH SCHOOLS THAT HAVE SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCED
8	THEIR DROPOUT RATE TO IDENTIFY PROGRAMS THAT MERIT REPLICATION
9	AND ASSESS THE PROGRESS OF PROGRAMS THAT ARE NO LONGER
10	RECEIVING DROPOUT PREVENTION GRANTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE
11	JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON DROPOUT PREVENTION AND HIGH
12	SCHOOL GRADUATION.
13	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
14	SECTION 1. Section 7.13(b)(3) of S.L. 2009-451 reads as rewritten:
15	"(3) Grants shall be distributed geographically throughout the State and
16	throughout the eight educational districts as defined in G.S. 115C-65. No
17	more than three grants shall be awarded in any one county under this section
18	in a single fiscal year. When grant applications are of equal quality and
19	merit, grants shall be given to applications from counties with no current
20	grant recipients."
21	SECTION 2. Section 7.13(b)(10) of S.L. 2009-451 reads as rewritten:
22	"(10) Priority for grants shall be given to programs that would serve students in
23	local schools that have a four-year cohort graduation rate of less than
24	sixty-five percent (65%). either: (i) a four-year cohort graduation rate of less
25	than sixty percent (60%) in the most recent school year and one of two prior
26	school years, or (ii) a performance composite under fifty percent (50%). The
27	Committee shall establish a grant rating cutoff score at such a level as to
28	allow for consideration of all viable grants in this priority category. The
29	Committee may require grantees to provide supplemental information in
30	response to any prior reviewer comments."
31	SECTION 3. Section 7.13(b)(11) of S.L. 2009-451 reads as rewritten:
32	"(11) Priority for grants shall be given to proposals demonstrating the potential for
33	success.success and that contain multiple evidence-based programmatic
34	elements that have been shown to be effective and replicable. The
35	Committee on Dropout Prevention shall use the evaluations from prior grant
36	cycles to identify the evidence-based programmatic elements."



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1	SECTION 4. Section 7.13(f) of S.L. 2009-451 is amended by adding a new
2	subdivision to read:
3	"(5) Up to one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year
4	shall be used by the Committee on Dropout Prevention to conduct a
5	systematic study of high schools that have reduced their dropout rate
6	significantly over the past three years to identify programs that merit
7	replication. This study shall be designed and conducted under the direction
8	of the Dropout Prevention Committee and shall include assessment of
9	successful programs in counties that have not received dropout prevention
10	grants and programs that received grants in previous years but are no longer
11	receiving dropout prevention grants. Such assessments shall be used for
12	comparison purposes with funded grants."
13	SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2010.
