5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Article 23 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by
7	adding a new section to read:
8	"§ 116-209.31. Scholarship Loan Fund for Social Workers in Underserved Areas.
9	(a) There is established the Scholarship Loan Fund for Social Workers in Underserved
10	Areas. The purpose of the Fund is to provide scholarship loans to train social workers to deliver
11	mental health, substance abuse, and developmental disabilities services in underserved areas of
12	North Carolina. The State Education Assistance Authority shall administer the Fund and shall
13	award 40 scholarship loans per year, 10 at each of the eligible institutions in subsection (b) of
14	this section.
15	(b) Students in masters programs of social work at the following institutions are eligible
16	to receive the Scholarship Loan Fund for Social Workers in Underserved Areas:
17	(1) <u>The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.</u>
18	(2) Appalachian State University.
19	(3) East Carolina University.
20	(4) <u>The joint program between the University of North Carolina at Greensboro</u>
21	and the North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University.
22	(c) Social Workers in Underserved Areas Fellows shall be offered a curriculum that
23	advances skills in evidence and research-based best practices for mental health, substance
24	abuse, and disabilities service delivery in underserved areas and that instills a strong motivation
25	to provide services in rural and other need-based areas. The coordinator of the academic
26	program, in consultation with the faculty of the eligible programs of social work, current
27	program coordinators of the local management entities in designated federal mental health
28	provider shortage areas, and the State chapter of the National Association of Social Workers,
29	shall develop, review, and revise the curriculum, program goals, progress, and outcomes.
30	(d) Criteria for awarding the scholarship loans shall be developed by the State
31	Education Assistance Authority in consultation with the Board of Governors of The University
32	of North Carolina and shall include all of the following:
33	(1) An applicant shall be enrolled in the second year of an accredited masters of
34	social work program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill,

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1	(h) The State Education Assistance Authority, in consultation with the Board of
2	Governors of The University of North Carolina, shall adopt rules to implement this section.
3	(i) The State Education Assistance Authority shall report to the Joint Legislative
4	Education Oversight Committee by March 1 of each year regarding the Fund and scholarship
5	loans awarded from the Fund."
6	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of
7	Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred sixty thousand dollars
8	(\$260,000) for the 2009-2010 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred sixty thousand dollars
9	(\$260,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year for a program coordinator, faculty, support staff, an
10	intensive training week, a placement event, advisory board meetings, and other costs of the
11	academic program. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Education
12	Assistance Authority for the 2010-2011 fiscal year the sum of four hundred forty thousand
13	dollars (\$440,000) for scholarship loans to implement this act.
14	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
