2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND			
3	HUMAN SERVICES, OFFICE OF RESEARCH, DEMONSTRATIONS, AND RURAL			
4	HEALTH DEVELOPMENT, FOR A GRANT PROGRAM TO ASSIST IN THE			
5 6	PROVISION OF PRIMARY AND PREVENTIVE MEDICAL SERVICES TO UNINSURED OR MEDICALLY INDIGENT PATIENTS.			
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
8	<b>SECTION 1.(a)</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of			
9	Health and Human Services, Office of Research, Demonstrations, and Rural Health			
10	Development (Office), the sum of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) for the 2009-2010 fiscal			
11	year. These funds shall be allocated to federally qualified health centers and those health			
12	centers that meet the criteria for federally qualified health centers, State-designated rural health			
13	centers, free clinics, public health departments, and other nonprofit organizations that provide			
14	primary and preventive medical services to uninsured or medically indigent patients. These			
15	funds shall be allocated as grants on a competitive basis to assist in the provision of care to			
16	uninsured or medically indigent patients. Grant funds appropriated in this act shall only be used

27	Grant funds may not be used to enhance or increase compensation or other benefits			
28	of personnel, administrators, directors, consultants, or any other parties. Grant funds may not be			
29	used to supplant federal funds traditionally received by federally qualified community health			
30	centers and may not be used to finance or satisfy any existing debt. In distributing funds, the			
31	Department of Health and Human Services shall consider the availability of other funds for the			
32	agency, the incidence of poverty or indigent clients served, arrangements for after-hours care,			
33	and collaboration with the applicant's community hospital and other safety net organizations.			
34	SECTION 1.(b) The Office shall work with the North Carolina Community Health			
35		Center Association (NCCHCA) and the North Carolina Public Health Association (NCPHA) to		
		establish an advisory committee to develop an objective and equitable process for awarding

37 grant funds. The Office shall also develop auditing and accountability procedures. Not more

than one percent (1%) of the funds appropriated in this section may be used to reimburse the
Office for administering the grant program in collaboration with the NCCHCA and the
NCPHA.

4 **SECTION 1.(c)** Recipients of grant funds shall annually provide to the Office a 5 written report detailing the number of uninsured and medically indigent patients that are cared 6 for, the types of services that were provided, and any other information requested by the Office 7 as necessary for evaluating the success of the grant program.

8 SECTION 1.(d) The Office shall work with the NCCHCA and NCPHA to study 9 and present recommendations for continuing funds to support the expansion of community 10 health centers, State-designated rural health centers, free clinics, and public health departments 11 to serve more of the State's uninsured and indigent population. The Department of Health and 12 Human Services shall report on the use of these funds to the House Appropriations 13 Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, the Senate Appropriations Committee on Health 14 and Human Services, and the Fiscal Research Division not later than March 1, 2010.

15 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
