| 4 | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: | | |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new | | |

| 8 | "North Carolina Citizens' Commission on Compensation for Elected State Officials. | | |

| 11 | (a) There is created a commission to be known as the North Carolina Citizens' | | |
| 12 | Commission on Compensation for Elected State Officials (hereinafter "Commission") to | | |
| 13 | consist of members appointed as follows: | | |
| 14 | (1) One member shall be selected by lot by the Secretary of State from among | | |
| 15 | the registered voters in each congressional district. The Secretary shall | | |
| 16 | establish policies and procedures for conducting the selection by lot. The | | |
| 17 | policies and procedures shall include, but not be limited to, notifying persons | | |
| 18 | selected and providing a new selection from a congressional district if a | | |
| 19 | person selected from the district is ineligible under subsection (d) or (f) of | | |
| 20 | this section, declines appointment to the Commission, or if a vacancy occurs | | |
| 21 | in one of those positions. The Secretary of State shall forward the names of | | |
| 22 | persons selected under this subdivision to the Governor who shall appoint | | |
| 23 | these persons to the Commission. A person appointed to the Commission, | | |
| 24 | except if removed under this section, may serve the entire term even if the | | |
| 25 | person moves to another congressional district or a congressional | | |

| 27 | (2) Three members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the | | |
| 28 | recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives. | | |
| 29 | (3) Three members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the | | |
| 30 | recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. | | |
| 31 | (4) Three members shall be appointed by the Governor. | | |
| 32 | (5) Three member shall be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. | | |
| 33 | Of the three persons recommended or appointed by each official listed in this subsection, at | | |
| 34 | least one shall be an individual with experience in private business evaluating and establishing | | |
| 35 | compensation for management and executives, and at least one other shall be an individual with | | |

| 3 | (b) Initial appointments to the Commission shall be made for terms beginning |
| 4 | September 1, 2009, and expiring August 31, 2011, or for terms beginning September 1, 2009, |
| 5 | and expiring August 31, 2013, and shall be drawn by lot with 12 of the initial members serving |
| 6 | two-year terms and the other 13 serving four-year terms. All subsequent terms shall be for four |
| 7 | years. Members appointed to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term. The |
| 8 | Secretary of State shall select the members appointed under subsection (a)(1) of this section |
| 9 | during the months of June or July of the year the terms are to commence, except that in 2009 |
| 10 | they may be chosen at any time. |
| 11 | (c) <u>The Commission shall choose from among its membership annually a chair to serve</u> |
| 12 | a one-year term beginning September 1. |
| 13 | (d) No person may be appointed to more than two terms on the Commission. Any |
| 14 | member of the Commission may be removed by the Governor during the member's term of |
| 15 | office for incapacity, incompetence, neglect of duty, malfeasance in or affecting the office, or |
| 16 | removal from the State. |
| 17 | (e) The unexcused absence of any person who is a member of the Commission from |
| 18 | two consecutive meetings of the Commission shall constitute the relinquishment of that |
| 19 | person's membership on the Commission. Such a relinquishment creates a vacancy in that |
| 20 | person's position on the Commission. A member's absence may be excused by the chair of the |
| 21 | Commission upon the member's written request if the chair believes there is just cause for the |
| 22 | absence. Such a request must be received by the chair before the meeting for which the absence |
| 23 | is to be excused. A member's absence from a meeting of the Commission may also be excused |
| 24 | during the meeting from which the member is absent by the affirmative vote of a majority of |
| 25 | the members of the Commission present at the meeting. |
| 26 | (f) <u>No current officer or employee of the State or local government, nor any lobbyist</u> |
| 27 | registered under Chapter 120C of the General Statutes, nor any immediate family member of |
| 28 | such an officer, employee, or lobbyist is eligible for membership on the Commission. As used |
| 29 | in this subsection, the phrase "immediate family" means the parents, spouse, siblings, children, |
| 30 | grandchildren, or dependent relative of the officer, employee, or lobbyist whether or not living |

| 33 34 | (a) <u>Members of the Commission shall receive compensation and per diem and travel</u> |
| 34 35 | <u>allowances in accordance with G.S. 138-5.</u> (b) The Commission may contract for consultants or hire employees in accordance with |

| 30 37 | Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist the Commission in its work. Upon the direction |

| 44 | other elected officials in North Carolina and other states, and such other information as the |
| 45 | Commission deems appropriate. Every two years, the Commission shall adopt a compensation |
| 46 | schedule for members and officers of the General Assembly, including the following |

| 10 | " <u>§ 120-297. Current compensation to remain in effect until changed.</u> |
| 11 | (a) The current rates for salary, mileage, travel allowance, expense allowance, and per |
| 12 | diem established in G.S. 120-3 and G.S. 120-3.1 shall remain in effect until changed under this |
| 13 | Article. |
| 14 | (b) The current salaries for justices and judges of the General Court of Justice, district |
| 15 | attorneys, and clerks of superior court established by law shall remain in effect until changed |
| 16 | under this Article. Nothing in this Article shall alter any other form of compensation or benefit |
| 17 | provided by law to justices and judges of the General Court of Justice, district attorneys, or |
| 18 | clerks of superior court. |
| 19 | (c) The current salaries of officials included in G.S. 120-296 shall remain in effect until |
| 20 | changed under this Article. Nothing in this Article shall alter any other form of compensation |
| 21 | or benefit provided by law to the officials listed in G.S. 120-296. |
| 22 | " <u>§ 120-298. Effectiveness of recommendations.</u> |
| 23 | (a) The compensation schedule adopted by the Commission under G.S. 120-294 shall |
| 24 | not become effective unless approved by the General Assembly and, if so approved by law, |
| 25 | shall become effective at the beginning of the next regular session of the General Assembly. |
| 26 | (b) The salary schedule adopted by the Commission under G.S. 120-295 and |
| 27 | G.S. 120-296 shall not become effective unless approved by the General Assembly and, if so |
| 28 | approved by law, shall become effective on July 1 of the year in which it was adopted by the |
| 29 | Commission, except that the salary of an elected official under Article III of the Constitution |
| 30 | shall not be diminished during the official's term of office, and the salary of an elected official |
| 31 | under Article IV of the Constitution shall not be diminished during the official's continuance in |
| 32 | office." |
| 33 | SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law. |
