S	ECTION 1. The catch line of G.S. 14-87 reads as rewritten:	
"§ 14-87. Robbery with firearms or other dangerous weapons, weapons; robbery with		
<u>a</u> j	pparent firearm."	

 "(e) Any person who possesses, uses, or threatens to use an apparent firearm that a reasonable person under the circumstances would believe endangered or threatened his or her life and who unlawfully takes or attempts to take personal property from another or from any place of business, residence, banking institution, or any other place where there is a person in attendance, at any time, either day or night, or who aids or abets any person in the commission of such crime is guilty of a Class D felony. For purposes of this subsection the term "apparent firearm" shall include any article that a reasonable person would believe to be a firearm."

SECTION 2. G.S. 14-87 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
