A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION TO STUDY
 COMPREHENSIVE REFORM OF THE STATE'S APPROACH TO COMMUNITY
 CORRECTIONS.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. The Department of Correction, in consultation with the Sentencing 6 7 and Policy Advisory Commission, the Administrative Office of the Courts, the Conference of District Attorneys, Office of Indigent Defense Services, the Department of Health and Human 8 9 Services, the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, the School of Government at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and other organizations and 10 agencies it deems appropriate, shall study comprehensive reform of the State's approach to 11 12 community corrections. The study shall consider the integration of evidence-based practices into all aspects of community corrections and the development of cost-effective ways to 13 manage offenders without compromising public safety. The study shall review data from North 14 Carolina and other states to identify best practices in community-based supervision and 15 treatment, proven through research-based evidence to reduce crime, decrease offender 16 17 recidivism rates, and improve offender reintegration into society. The study shall estimate the costs of the identified programs and their projected impact on offender populations in prison 18 19 and under community supervision. The Department shall report its findings, including proposed legislation to enact a comprehensive Community Corrections Act, to the Legislative 20 Corrections, Crime Control, and Juvenile Justice Oversight Committee no later than April 1, 21 22 2010.

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SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
