A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION TO STUDY ISSUES RELATED TO THE USE OF INTRABASIN AND INTERBASIN NETTING BY CONTRACT AMONG WATER UTILITIES.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** The Environmental Review Commission, with the assistance of the 7 Department of Environment and Natural Resources, shall study the feasibility and 8 environmental impact of intrabasin and interbasin netting of water withdrawals and discharges 9 by contract among water systems subject to regulation by the North Carolina Utilities 10 Commission ("water utilities"). The Commission shall address, at a minimum, the following 11 issues:

- 12 (1) The advisability of and statutory changes needed to allow water utilities 13 located in the same river basin to combine their existing interbasin transfer 14 certificate capacities within a particular river basin so that the net transfers 15 do not exceed the statutory threshold imposed by G.S. 143-215.22L for a 16 new interbasin transfer certificate.
- 17(2)The advisability of and statutory changes needed to allow water utilities to18elect to enter into regional agreements to create a net water balance between19river basins utilizing each utility's current interbasin transfer certificate so20that the net transfers between basins do not exceed the statutory threshold21imposed by G.S. 143-215.22L for a new interbasin transfer certificate.
- 22(3)How the measures described in paragraphs (1) and (2) above would impact23the purposes and findings set forth in the Regional Water Supply Planning24Act of 1971, as set out in G.S. 162A-21.

In the conduct of this study, the Environmental Review Commission may employ independent consultants as provided in G.S. 120-32.02 and G.S. 120-70.44. The Environmental Review Commission may submit an interim report to the 2010 Regular Session of the 2009 General Assembly and shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations, including any legislative proposals, to the 2011 General Assembly.

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
