1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO REDUCE SPENDING BY ELIMINATING STATEWIDE STANDARDIZED  
3 TESTING IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS, EXCEPT AS REQUIRED BY FEDERAL LAW  
4 OR AS A CONDITION OF A FEDERAL GRANT.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-174.11 reads as rewritten:

7 "**§ 115C-174.11. Components of the testing program.**

8 (a) Assessment Instruments for First and Second Grades. – The State Board of  
9 Education shall adopt and provide to the local school administrative units developmentally  
10 appropriate individualized assessment instruments consistent with the Basic Education Program  
11 for the first and second grades, rather than standardized tests. Local school administrative units  
12 may use these assessment instruments provided to them by the State Board for first and second  
13 grade students, and shall not use standardized tests except as required as a condition of  
14 receiving federal grants.

16 (c) Annual Testing Program.

17 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt a system of annual testing ~~the tests~~  
18 for grades three through 12 that are required by federal law or as a  
19 condition of a federal grant. These tests shall be designed to measure  
20 progress toward reading, communication skills, and mathematics for grades  
21 three through eight, and toward competencies ~~designated by the State Board~~  
22 for grades nine through 12. ~~The State Board may develop and implement a~~  
23 plan for high school end-of-course tests that must be aligned with the content  
24 standards developed under G.S. 115C-12(9e). Students who do not pass the  
25 tests adopted for eighth grade shall be provided remedial instruction in the  
26 ninth grade.

27 (2) If the State Board of Education finds that additional testing in grades three  
28 through 12 is desirable to allow comparisons with national indicators of  
29 student achievement, that testing shall be conducted with the smallest size  
30 sample of students necessary to assure valid comparisons with other states.

31 (d) Except as provided in subdivision (2) of subsection (c) of this section, the State  
32 Board of Education shall not require the public schools to administer any standardized tests  
33 except for those required by federal law or as a condition of a federal grant.

34 The State Board of Education shall adopt and provide to local school administrative units  
35 all tests required by federal law or as a condition of a federal grant."



- 1           **SECTION 2.** The following end-of-course tests are hereby eliminated:  
2           (1)     United States History.  
3           (2)     Civics and Economics.  
4           (3)     Algebra II.  
5           (4)     Physical Science.  
6           **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2011.
