AN ACT TO ALLOW WINERIES TO SELL MALT BEVERAGES AT RETAIL ON THE
PREMISES OF THE WINERY.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. G.S. 18B-1001(1) reads as rewritten:

6	"(1)	On-Premises Malt Beverage Permit. – An on-premises malt beverage permit
7		authorizes the retail sale of malt beverages for consumption on the premises
8		and the retail sale of malt beverages in the manufacturer's original container
9		for consumption off the premises. It also authorizes the holder of the permit
10		to ship malt beverages in closed containers to individual purchasers inside
11		and outside the State. The permit may be issued for any of the following:
12		a. Restaurants;
13		b. Hotels;
14		c. Eating establishments;
15		d. Food businesses;
16		e. Retail businesses;
17		f. Private clubs;
18		g. Convention centers;
19		h. Community theatres.
20		The permit may also be issued to certain breweries as authorized by
