9	<b>SECTION 2.(c)</b> The Commission shall terminate upon filing its final report.		
0	SECTION 2.(d) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President		
1	Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each appoint a cochair for the Commission. The Commission		
2	may contract for consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02. Upon approval of the		
3	Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and		
4	clerical staff to assist in the work of the Commission. Clerical staff shall be furnished to the		
5	Commission through the offices of the House of Representatives and the Senate Directors of		
5	Legislative Assistants. The Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the		
7	Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the Legislative Services Commission.		
8	Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances at the		
9	rate established in G.S. 120-3.1. The appointing authority shall fill vacancies. The Commission,		
0	while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all the powers provided under the		
1	provisions of G.S. 120-19 through G.S. 120-19.4, including the power to request all officers,		
2	agents, agencies, and departments of the State to provide any information, data, or documents		
3	within their possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them and the		
4 5	power to subpoena witnesses.		
5	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Appropriation. – There is appropriated from the General Fund to the		
6 7	General Assembly the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2011-2012 fiscal year and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2012-2013 fiscal year to fund the work		

and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2012-2013 fiscal year to fund the work
of the Innovations in Education Legislative Study Commission created by this act.

**SECTION 4.** Effective Date. – This act becomes effective July 1, 2011.
