11	<u>(1)</u>	There is a need for a person to have the freedom to choose the manner, cost,
12		and setting for giving birth.
13	<u>(2)</u>	Access to prenatal care and delivery services is limited by the inadequate
14		number of providers of midwifery services and the practice of midwifery
15		may help to reduce this shortage.
16	<u>(3)</u>	There is a need for the safe and effective delivery of newborn babies and the
17		health, safety, and welfare of their mothers in the delivery process.
18	<u>(4)</u>	In the interest of public health, the State should promote the regulation of the
19		practice of midwifery for the purpose of protecting the health and welfare of
20		women and infants.
21	<u>(5)</u>	Midwifery is a profession in its own right and it is not the practice of
22		medicine.

2	services authorized under this Article in a safe manner.

5	A certified professional midwife licensed pursuant to this Article may receive third-party
6	reimbursement from private agencies that provide coverage for maternity and obstetrical care.
7	A managed care organization or insurance company may not require a patient to be served by a
8	licensee instead of a licensed physician or nurse practitioner.

20	(a) The Council may apply to the superior court for an order enjoining violations of this
1	Article. Upon a showing by the Council that any person has violated this Article, the court may
2	grant injunctive relief.
.3	(b) No health care provider shall be liable for an injury to a woman or infant arising
4	during childbirth and resulting from an act or omission by a midwife licensed under this
5	Article, regardless of whether the health care provider has consulted with or accepted a referral
6	from the licensee."
