1	State or federal funding for domestic violence or sexual assault services; and any member who
2	is an appointed or elected official of the community or county in which the center or centers
3	applying for a grant is located.
4	The Department of Administration shall make quarterly grants to each eligible domestic
5	violence center and to The North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence, Inc. Each
6	grant recipient shall receive the same amount. To be eligible to receive funds under this section,
7	a domestic violence center must meet the following requirements:
8	(1) It shall have been in operation on the preceding July 1 and shall continue to
9	be in operation.
10	(2) It shall offer all of the following services: a hotline, transportation services,
11	community education programs, daytime services, and call forwarding
12	during the night and it shall fulfill other criteria established by the
13	Department of Administration.
14	(3) It shall be a nonprofit corporation or a local governmental entity."
15	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and shall apply to
16	applications for grants from the Domestic Violence Center Fund for the 2012-2013 fiscal year.
