A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION TO REDUCE THE AGE OF ELIGIBILITY TO HOLD ELECTED OFFICE FROM TWENTY-ONE TO EIGHTEEN IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE THE PARTICIPATION OF YOUNG NORTH CAROLINIANS IN LOCAL AND STATE GOVERNMENT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** Section 6 of Article VI of the North Carolina Constitution reads as rewritten:

## **"Sec. 6. Eligibility to elective office.**

10 Every qualified voter in North Carolina who is 2118 years of age, except as in this  
11 Constitution disqualified, shall be eligible for election by the people to office."

"[ ] FOR [ ] AGAINST

Constitutional amendment to reduce the age of eligibility for election by the people to office from 21 to 18 years of age."

20                   **SECTION 3.** If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the  
21 amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the  
22 amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so  
23 certified among the permanent records of that office.

**SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
