2	AN ACT TO MAKE TECHNICAL, CLARIFYING, AND SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES			
3	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; AND TO AUTHORIZE			
4	THE SECRETARY OF ADMINISTRATION TO CHANGE CERTAIN BENCHMARKS			
5	RELATING TO PURCHASES AND CONTRACTS.			
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-196.3 is repealed.			
8	SECTION 2. G.S. 143-134 reads as rewritten:			
9	"§ 143-134. Applicable to Department of Transportation and Division of Adult			
10	Correction of the Department of Public Safety; exceptions; all contracts subject			
11	to review by Attorney General and State Auditor.			
12	(a) This Article shall apply to the Department of Transportation and the Division of			
13	Adult Correction of the Department of Public Safety except in the construction of roads,			
14	bridges and their approaches; provided however, that whenever the Director of the Budget			
15	determines that the repair or construction of a building by the Department of Transportation or			
16	by the Division of Adult Correction of the Department of Public Safety can be done more			
17	economically through use of employees of the Department of Transportation and/or prison			
18	inmates than by letting such repair or building construction to contract, the provisions of this			
19	Article shall not apply to such repair or construction.			
20	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, the Department of			
21	Transportation and the Division of Adult Correction of the Department of Public Safety shall:			
22	(i) submit all proposed contracts for supplies, materials, printing, equipment, and contractual			
23	services that exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the Attorney General or the Attorney			
24	General's designee for review as provided in G.S. 114-8.3; and (ii) include in all contracts to be			
25	awarded by the Department of Transportation or the Division of Adult Correction of the			
26	Department of Public Safety a standard clause which provides that the State Auditor and			
27	internal auditors of the Department of Transportation or the Department of Public Safety may			
28	audit the records of the contractor during and after the term of the contract to verify accounts			
29	and data affecting fees and performance. Neither the Department of Transportation nor the			
30	Division of Adult Correction of the Department of Public Safety shall award a cost plus			
31	percentage of cost agreement or contract for any purpose."
