March 28, 2013 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT PROVIDING THAT A VENDOR IS QUALIFIED FOR PURPOSES OF ANY 3 STATE FURNITURE REQUIREMENTS CONTRACT IF THE VENDOR'S PRODUCTS 4 ARE INCLUDED ON A UNITED STATES GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION 5 (GSA) FURNITURE SCHEDULE, THE VENDOR IS A FEDERALLY QUALIFIED 6 VENDOR FOR THE GSA FURNITURE SCHEDULE, AND THE VENDOR OFFERS 7 PRODUCTS ON THE SAME PRICING AND SPECIFICATIONS AS THE GSA 8 FURNITURE SCHEDULE. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 SECTION 1. G.S. 143-57.1 reads as rewritten: 11 "§ 143-57.1. Furniture requirements contracts. 12 State Furniture Requirements Contract. - To ensure agencies access to sufficient (a) sources of furniture supply and service, to provide agencies the necessary flexibility to obtain 13 14 furniture that is compatible with interior architectural design and needs, to provide small and disadvantaged businesses additional opportunities to participate on State requirements 15 contracts, and to restore the traditional use of multiple award contracts for purchasing furniture 16 17 requirements, each State furniture requirements contract shall be awarded on a multiple award 18 basis, subject to the following conditions: 19 Competitive, sealed bids must be solicited for the contract in accordance (1)with Article 3 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes unless otherwise 20 21 provided for by the State Purchasing Officer pursuant to that Article. Bids shall be solicited on a historical weighted average of specific contract items 22 23 and not on a single item within a class of items. Historical weighted average shall be based on information derived from the State's electronic 24 25 procurement system, when available, or other available data. 26 Subject to the provisions of this section, bids shall be evaluated and the (2)contract awarded in accordance with Article 3 of Chapter 143 of the General 27 28 Statutes. 29 For each category of goods under each State requirements furniture contract, (3)awards shall be made to at least three qualified vendors unless three 30 qualified vendors are not available. Additionally, if the State Purchasing 31 32 Officer determines that there are no qualified vendors within the three best qualified vendors who offer furniture manufactured or produced in North 33 Carolina or who are incorporated in the State, the State Purchasing Officer 34 shall expand the number of qualified vendors awarded contracts to as many 35



qualified vendors as is necessary to include a qualified vendor who offers
