1	(h1) Food Services. – The charter school shall provide food services to students whose
2	household income makes the student eligible for the free and reduced lunch program as
3	established by the federal government. The State Board of Education may waive this
4	requirement upon a showing of financial hardship by the charter school. In the operation of
5	their food service programs, charter schools may participate in the National School Lunch
6	Program established by the federal government. The program shall be under the jurisdiction of
7	the Division of School Support, Child Nutrition Services of the Department of Public
8	Instruction, and shall be operated in accordance with federal guidelines as established by the
9	Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture.

11	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies only to charter

12 schools granted a new or renewed charter on or after July 1, 2013.
