24		whom the expense was incurred.
25	<u>(4)</u>	The elections to which the independent expenditures pertain and the names
26		of the candidates supported or opposed by the independent expenditures.
27	<u>(5)</u>	The names and addresses of all entities that donated, to further an
28		independent expenditure or independent expenditures, funds or anything of
29		value whatsoever in an aggregate amount of more than one hundred dollars
30		(\$100.00) during the reporting period, and the date and amount of the
31		donation received. If the donor is an individual, the report shall also contain
32		the principal occupation of the donor. The "principal occupation of the
33		donor" shall mean the same as the "principal occupation of the contributor"

4	of Elections shall require the identification of each person or entity making a donation of more
5	than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to the entity filing the report if the donation was made to
6	further the reported independent expenditure or contribution. If the donor is an individual, the
7	statement shall also contain the principal occupation of the donor. The "principal occupation of
8	the donor" shall mean the same as the "principal occupation of the contributor" in
9	G.S. 163-278.11.

11	reported under this section shall be reported at the earliest of the following dates:

22	entity incurring expenses or receiving donations to further independent expenditures that
23 24	aggregate to more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) during a period not covered by a
24 25	previous report. A final report of donations and expenditures required to be reported but not included in a previous report shall be filed by 30 days after the election the independent

20 27	(d2) Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections (b) and (c), an individual, person,
28	or other entity required to report under this section to a county board of elections shall file an
20 29	additional report within 48 hours of incurring expenses to further independent expenditures that
30	aggregate to more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) during a period not covered by a previous
31	report in the 30 days before the election.
32	(e) The State Board of Elections shall require subsequent reporting of independent
33	expenditures according to the same schedule required of political committees under
34	G.S. 163-278.9(a). An individual or person that makes an independent expenditure shall
35	disclose by report to the State Board of Elections within 48 hours of incurring an expense of
36	five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or more or receiving a donation of one thousand dollars (\$1,000)
37	or more for making an independent expenditure before an election but after the period covered
38	by the last report due before that election.
39	(f) For the purposes of subsection (c) of this section, a donation to the person or entity
40	making the independent expenditure is deemed to have been donated to further the independent
41	expenditure if any of subdivisions (1) through (4) of this subsection apply. For purposes of this
42	subsection, the "filer" is the person or entity making the independent expenditure and
43	responsible for filing the report, or an agent of that person or entity. For purposes of this
44	subsection, the "donor" is the person or entity donating to the filer the funds or other thing of
45	value, or an agent of that person or entity.

47	independent expenditure or for multiple independent expenditures, and the
48	filer agrees to use the donation for an independent expenditure.

5	make electioneering communication with the donation.
6	A donation shall not be deemed to be made to further an electioneering communication if
7	the donation was a commercial transaction occurring in the ordinary course of business
8	between the donor and the filer unless there is affirmative evidence that the amounts were
9	donated to further an electioneering communication. In determining the amount of a donation
10	that was made to further any particular electioneering communication, there shall be excluded
11	any amount that was designated by the donor with respect to a different election than the
12	election that is the subject of the electioneering communication covered by the report.
13	(d) All reports required by this section shall be filed according to rules adopted by the
14	State Board. If the expense incurred is greater than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), the report
15	shall be filed-electronically. The State Board shall provide the software necessary to file the
16	electronic report to any individual or person required to file an electronic report at no cost to
17	that individual or person."
18	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective September 1, 2013, and applies to
19	donations, contributions, and expenditures made on or after that date.
