6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
7	SECTION 1. Article 8 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by			
8	adding a new section to read:

10	<u>(a)</u> <u>Re</u>	elease Time for Religious Instruction Local boards of	education may adopt	
11	policies authorizing students to attend a class in religious instruction conducted by a private			
12	entity at an off-campus location that is not school property during the instructional day if the			
13	policy contains all of the following requirements:			
14	<u>(1</u>)) The student's parent or guardian provides written conse	ent to the school.	
15	<u>(2</u>)	<u>) The sponsoring entity maintains attendance recor</u>	ds and makes them	
16		available to the school the student attends.		
17	<u>(3</u>)	<u>) The transportation to and from the off-campus place of</u>	f instruction, including	
18		transportation for children with disabilities, shall be th	ne responsibility of the	
19		sponsoring entity, parent, or guardian.		
20	<u>(4</u>)	<u>) The sponsoring entity shall make provisions for and</u>	shall assume liability	
21		for the student attending the class in religious instruction	<u>on.</u>	
22	<u>(5</u>)	<u>No public funds from any source shall be expended for</u>	r and no public school	
23		personnel shall be involved in providing religious instr	uction.	
24	<u>(6</u>)) Students shall not be released from a core academic su	ubject class to attend a

26	<u>(7</u>)) Students shall not be considered absent from scho	ool while attending a

28		responsibility of a participating student to make up any	missed coursework.	
29	<u>(b)</u> <u>El</u>	ective Credit for Religious Instruction A local board of	education may award	
30	high school students no more than two elective course credits for the completion of classes in			
31	religious instruction attended as provided in subsection (a) of this section. A local board shall			
32	consider the following criteria in determining whether to award elective course credit for a			
33	religious instruction course:			
34	(1)	<u>) The course shall be evaluated on the basis of purely s</u>	ecular criteria that are	
35		substantially the same criteria used to evaluate	similar classes at a	
36		nonaccredited nonpublic school for the purpose of d	letermining whether a

1	student transferring to a public high school from a nonaccredited nonpublic
2	high school would be awarded elective credit for such classes. Secular
3	criteria may include the following:
4	a. <u>Number of hours of classroom instruction time.</u>
5	b. <u>Review of the course syllabus which reflects the course requirements</u>
6	and materials used.
7	<u>c.</u> <u>Methods of assessment used in the course.</u>
8	d. Whether the course was taught by a certified teacher.
9	(2) The decision to award elective course credit shall be neutral as to, and shall
10	not involve any test for, religious content or denominational affiliation.
11	(3) Elective course credit awarded under this section shall be indicated on a
12	student transcript as a pass or fail and shall not be included in calculation of
13	class rank or a student's grade point average."
14	SECTION 2. This section is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning
15	with the 2013-2014 school year.
